### PSALM 143

**O Lord, hear my prayer, listen to my cry for mercy; in your faithfulness and righteousness come to my relief.**

#### **“NO CONDEMNATION”**

Paul begins the eighth chapter of Romans saying, “*There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.*” There is no condemnation, because Jesus has paid the debt owed for our sin and for the sin of the world. There is no condemnation, because through His rising from death, Jesus has lifted the sentence of eternal death from the heads of those who believe. He is the resurrection and the life and in Him we have the promise of rising to a new and eternal life!

Despite the continuing presence of the sinful nature, He treats us not as our sins deserve, but as a kind hearted parent seeking what is good for His children. There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus and so we live by the Spirit and seek to please God with our lives. Living in the Spirit, we know that in all things God is working for our good in time and our greatest good in eternity. We live each day in the confidence of God's love promised to us through our baptism into Christ Jesus. We know that nothing will be able to separate us from God's love, because there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.
