### PSALM 146

### Romans 12:1-21

#### **“LIVING SACRIFICES”**

When St. Paul urged the Christians at Rome to offer their bodies as living sacrifices, the word sacrifice was understood as specifically referring to offerings devoted to a god. A sacrifice was something that was offered to a god, to pay a debt, to assuage the deity's anger, or simply to grease the god's palms, so the deity would be inclined to give you something. A sacrifice generally involved the ritual killing of an animal. Living sacrifice must have sounded like a contradiction of terms. Jesus changed the nature of sacrifice by offering His body on the cross to make atonement for the sin of the world.

When Jesus died the need for sacrifice as an offering in death, ceased. God accepted His sacrifice. His offering fully and forever put an end to sacrifices of blood. Those who live in Christ receive the benefits of His sacrifice daily, in the forgiveness of sin and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Those who live in Christ are able to offer themselves as living sacrifices, by seeking to love and serve others as Christ loves and serves us.

Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice, by offering himself on the cross in payment for the sin of the world. Jesus was the most perfect and precious sacrifice. He gave what He did not need to give, to pay a debt He did not owe. He sacrificed because of His deep love for the Father, for us and for every human soul. He sacrificed as an expression of the kindness of God's love. St. Paul wrote, *“But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Saviour appeared, He saved us, not because of deeds done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy...through Jesus Christ our Saviour.”*

Because Jesus offered Himself as a sacrifice unto death, we can now offer ourselves as living sacrifices; giving thanks to God, by sharing His kindness with others and by living lives that bring praise to His name. In Jesus' Name. Amen
