### Psalm 85

#### **"Your King Comes to You"**

In anticipation of Christ's birth, the prophet Isaiah prayed that the Lord would "*rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence.*" When the time was right, God did just that He rent the heavens and came down, though not quite the way most people anticipated. He came down quietly—there was no earthquake—and humbly—born to a young woman in a stable in an out of the way part of one of the greatest empires the world has seen. He came humbly and quietly in keeping with the words of the prophet Zechariah who said, "*Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is He, humble and mounted on a donkey.*"

Jesus' came into this world much the same way He entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to be received as king; in humility, riding on a donkey. When a celebrity has a child there is a press release, a press conference, photographs and more paparazzi than you can shake a stick at. The celebrity parents are followed and their every move with their new born child is scrutinized. Thank the Lord they had no paparazzi and social media when Jesus was born. What would people have thought of the Son of God being born in a barn?

When a new Caesar began his reign, festivities were held throughout the Roman world. Pageantry is central to the celebration of power in the world, ancient and modern. Consider the great balls, concerts and other revelries that accompany the coronation of a queen, or the inauguration of a president. But Jesus is not the kind of king who needs glitz, glamour and pageantry to legitimize His rule, or make a statement about His authority. The world needs coloured lights and a lot of noise, but our Saviour and King comes quietly and gently into His kingdom and into the hearts of those over whom He would reign.

During Advent we look to see our King in places of quietness and humility. We speak to Him in prayer. We hear Him speak in the word. We receive Him in the sacraments. We see Him in our fellowship with one another. He comes righteous and humble with salvation for all to receive through faith in Him. During Advent and Christmas, we greet Him in the spirit of the words of the beloved hymn, "*O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today.*"
