### "Good News"

In the ancient world runners would relay messages between commanders in the field of battle and bring news of victory or defeat, to those who waited behind the lines. The better the news the faster the messenger ran. The bearer of good news often received a reward for his efforts. A messenger would probably not hurry to deliver bad news. He wouldn't receive a reward. It might even cost him his neck.

The marathon originated in ancient Greece, the Spartans and Athenians won an almost miraculous victory against the mighty Persian Empire near the village of Marathon. The runner ran so fast with the good news that when he completed the 25 miles and delivered his message, he fell down dead! That wasn't good news, but it shows how important the news was to him and how eager his Athenian masters were to hear it.

As Christians we have even greater news to share; the good news of Jesus' victory over sin, the devil and death. Jesus was born into the world to battle against the greatest tyrants; sin, the devil and death. He won the victory through His cross. He publishes peace with God through His resurrection.

He sends believers throughout the earth to publish the good news of His victory, which gives salvation and peace with God to all who believe. We have good news to share at Advent, during the Christmas season and always; the good news of forgiveness, peace with God and eternal life for the sake of Christ Jesus. Jesus won the greatest victory! God offers the fruits of His victory for all to receive. Truly Isaiah sang: "*How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation...*"
