

## DEVOTION FOR THE SIXTH FRIDAY OF EASTER

### PSALM 109:21-31

**But you, O God my Lord, deal on my behalf for your name's sake; because your steadfast love is good, deliver me!**

For I am poor and needy, and my heart is stricken within me.

**I am gone like a shadow at evening; I am shaken off like a locust.**

My knees are weak through fasting; my body has become gaunt with no fat.

**I am an object of scorn to my accusers; when they see me they wag their heads.**

Help me, O Lord my God! Save me according to your steadfast love!

**Let them know that this is your hand; you, O Lord have done it!**

Let them curse, but you will bless! They arise and are put to shame, but your servant will be glad!

**May my accusers be clothed with dishonour; may they be wrapped in their own shame as in a cloak.**

With my mouth I will give great thanks to the Lord; I will praise Him in the midst of the throng.

**For He stands at the right hand of the needy, to save him from those who condemn his soul to death.**

New Testament Reading: Hebrews 8:1-13 *Jesus' covenant greater than Moses'*

### “A NEW COVENANT”

Covenants were part of the legal code of peoples in the ancient near east. They were typically enacted with the ritual sacrifice of an animal. The blood sealed the covenant and obligated each party to fulfill their end of the deal. The animal was divided into two parts. This symbolized the penalty for violating the terms of the covenant. The parties making covenant passed between the two parts. This affirmed their agreement to the terms. In the case of a covenant between two unequal parties, only the weaker of the two would complete this ritual. By this act they would acknowledge the benevolence of the superior party and accept responsibility for the bad things that would happen, if they didn't keep their part of the deal. A concept that should be familiar to anyone who has taken out a big mortgage with a large lender.

God made covenant with Israel through Moses on Mount Sinai. That covenant included features common to covenants at the time. God promised His benefits. Israel accepted the terms in obedience to the moral and ceremonial laws. Israel acknowledged the punishments that would result from their violation of the covenant. However, unlike the covenants of the day, the Lord also provided the means of forgiveness, through the sacrificial service of the tabernacle and later the temple. The sins of the people would fall on the animals sacrificed in the temple

The author of Hebrews speaks of Jesus as the high priest of a better covenant than that which God made through Moses. It is a better covenant, because it was made with better promises of forgiveness and eternal life. There was forgiveness in the covenant God made through Moses. The animals sacrificed in the temple bore the guilt of the sin of the people. Yet their blood didn't actually appease God's anger at sin. Rather, these pointed towards the sacrifice Jesus would make, in giving Himself to take away the sin of the world. The sin of the world fell on Him. His sacrifice atoned for it all! The promises of forgiveness and life are better and more certain in the New Covenant, because they are signed in Jesus' blood and sealed by His resurrection.
