"WHAT DOES THE LORD REQUIRE?"

Before Israel's second attempt at entering the Promised Land, Moses recounted the giving of the Law at Mount Horeb (known also as Sinai), Israel's rebellion and the Lord's forgiveness, mediated by him. The Lord gave Israel His holy law as an expression of His righteousness; both so they would know His love and so they would know how to serve Him, in love. All that the Lord required of Israel was that they would receive His love through faith and express their love in faithfulness to Him.

"What does the Lord your God require of you, but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in all His ways, to love Him, to serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments and statues of the Lord?" Israel's relationship with God began with His love. Israel expressed its relationship with the Lord by responding with love. St. John summed it up when he said, "We love because He first loved us."

Our relationship with God begins with love, His love expressed in giving Jesus to be our Saviour. What does the Lord require of us? He simply requires us to believe He loves us and has given Jesus to die for our sins. We walk with the Lord as ancient Israel did, in love. Echoing the words of Deuteronomy, the prophet Micah said, "And what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God." We receive His love in the kindness of forgiveness for the sake of Jesus. We express our thanks for His love by sharing His kindness in forgiveness towards others.
