

Devotion for Epiphany 2

Psalm 139:1-18

**O Lord, you have searched me and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise;
you perceive my thoughts from afar.**

You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways. Before a word is on my tongue you know it completely, O Lord. You hem me in behind and before; you have laid your hand upon me.

**Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.
Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?**

If I go up to the heavens you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.

**If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me,
your right hand will hold me fast.**

If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me," even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you.

**For you created my inmost being, you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am
fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.**

Come and See

Nathaniel was initially skeptical when Philip told him, "We have found Him of whom Moses wrote in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." He wondered how anyone from an obscure and perhaps disreputable place such as Nazareth, could be the one spoken of by such exalted figures as Moses and the prophets. How could someone from Nazareth possibly be the long-awaited Messiah, the King of Israel?

Philip didn't argue or try to convince Nathaniel that Jesus was the one Israel awaited with great expectancy, he simply said, "Come and see." He would let Jesus do the convincing. Nathaniel was curious enough to respond to the invitation. Jesus spoke. Nathaniel saw and believed the most amazing things about Jesus. He exclaimed "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!"

Beginning with John the Baptist who said, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," continuing with two disciples who went and told others, the good news of Jesus is relayed person to person, through the sharing of the gospel. Someone told us about Jesus, asked us to come and see. We came and saw and through His word, Jesus convinced us He is the Christ the Son of God, our Saviour. In the same way we share Jesus with others, simply by calling them to "Come and see." We call and Jesus convinces!
