### Psalm 98

### God is Love

#### 1 John 4:16

***"So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him."***

St. John was a dear friend of Jesus as well as being His disciple. He is referred to as "*the beloved disciple*." For this reason, John sat closest to Jesus during the Last Supper. When the other disciples wanted clarification as to what Jesus said, they asked John. John stood with Jesus' mother Mary at the foot of the cross. Jesus, knowing that His earthly ministry was about to be fulfilled in death, resurrection and ascension, entrusted His mother to the beloved disciples' care. He said to her, "*Woman behold your son*." He said to John, "*Behold, your mother*." From then until the end of her life, John cared for Mary as his mother. John had a close friendship with Jesus and so his gospel and his letters express Jesus in a warm and intimate manner.

No New Testament writer uses the word 'love' more often than John. Jesus is presented in loving images as the Good Shepherd, the Light of the world, the Gate by which the sheep enter the presence of the heavenly Father. John records Jesus' words, "*For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whoever believes in Him would not perish, but have eternal life*." In His first letter John says "*God is love*." God's love finds its fullest expression in Jesus, given to bear the sin of the world, given that all who receive Him would have forgiveness and eternal life.

Because God is love, Jesus' commandment is that we love one another. God has made us His children in Christ Jesus to live in a loving relationship with Him and to live in love with each other; forgiving as He has forgiven us, treating each other with patience and kindness. No one has ever seen God in His divine essence, but we do see Him in the love we have for one another, in the faith and fellowship we share in Christ Jesus. We see God's love most clearly in Jesus and the sacrifice of His cross. John writes, "*In this is love, not that we have loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins and not only for our sins, but also for the sins of the whole world*."

God is love in essence and in action. We live in the essence of God's love by expressing His love in our actions. Even as God testifies to His love through the witness of the water of baptism and the blood of the cross, so we

testify to God's love through the words of our lips and the actions of our lives; calling other people to faith, so that they too may receive God's love and the salvation offered to all people through faith in Jesus' Name. Amen
