"NEVER DOUBT an ANGEL WITH GOOD NEWS"

Zechariah and Elizabeth are the parents of John, who came to be known as "The Baptizer." That name came much later, probably long after they had departed this life to rest in the Lord's peace. They simply called him, "John." It's a nice name, but it was an odd name, since there was no one in their family called John; and children were typically named after a relation, often the father. They called him "John" because the angel told them to name him "John." After Zechariah's experience in the temple, they weren't about to second guess the Lord's angel.

When the angel Gabriel told Zechariah the good news that their prayers had been heard and were about to be answered, he said, "*How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years.*" The angel was clearly annoyed. Wasn't he proof enough? How many times had Zechariah been greeted by an angel when he was offering incense in the temple? I'll tell you how often: Never! Apparently, seeing isn't believing. However, silence is golden! For a sign, the angel granted Elizabeth nine months of peace and quiet. Zechariah would be unable to speak until the angel's words were fulfilled and he named the child "John!"

Part of the message of John's birth is the power of God's word and the necessity of taking His word to heart and believing it. Zechariah was chastised by the angel, not because the angel took personal offense. Zechariah was chastised, because he did not believe the word the Lord spoke through His angel. When Zechariah believed the word, he saw the power of the Lord; both in the birth of John and in the return of his speech. There is no force more powerful than the word of the Lord. There is nothing that pleases the Lord more than that we take His word to heart and believe it. The most important word He wants us to believe is the gospel of salvation in Jesus. He is the Word of God in the fullest sense! Those who believe in Him have eternal life, in time and for eternity.
