### “PURE RELIGION”

Religion is the way in which we express our beliefs about God. James says that a living faith in God expresses itself in love towards others, especially the neediest. He says, “*Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction...*” We can't claim faith in God while abandoning our responsibility to love our brothers and sisters.

In the second chapter of this letter, he writes: “*What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can that faith save him? Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, ‘Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed,’ but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.*” His point being that a real and living faith, naturally expresses itself in loving actions, directed toward other human beings in terms of their physical and spiritual needs.

He is not saying that our love and acts of kindness save us. He is saying that they are signs that we are saved! Good deeds are the barometer of faith. Even as a healthy apple tree produces apples, so a living faith manifests itself in actions of love directed toward others. The fruit of faith is, “*To look after widows and orphans in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.*”
