Psalm 30

"FAITH and FEAR"

A woman came to Jesus, trembling with fear. She had an affliction, a discharge of blood that she had suffered with for twelve years. It was risky for her to be in a crowd. Her condition made her ritually unclean and would have made anyone who came into contact with her unclean, including Jesus. She came because He was her last hope. Despite medical attention that had left her poor, her condition hadn't improved. She stretched out her hand and thought, "If I just touch His garments." Her fear was strong, but her faith was stronger. She touched His clothes and instantly she felt she was healed.

Jesus was walking with a man whose daughter was deathly ill. He hoped Jesus could help, if he could just get Him to her in time. But as they walked Jesus was delayed by a woman who touched His garment. As He blessed her, a man came and gave him the message he dreaded, "Your daughter is dead." His hope evaporated, but Jesus said, "Do not fear, only believe." Imagine how he struggled with fear every step on the way home. Imagine how his heart sank when he saw his daughter dead. He remembered Jesus' words to believe and then beyond all human hope, Jesus called his daughter back to life.

Jesus calls to have faith and He empowers us to believe. Yet, in this life we respond to Jesus with a mixture of faith and fear. Faith is not having fear. Faith is trusting Jesus despite our fears. Neither the woman with the bleeding of the synagogue ruler had a fearless faith. Both struggled with fear and doubt as we all do. Jesus did not turn them away. He drew them closer to Himself through His words. Faith is clinging to Jesus despite our fears. Faith is coming to Jesus with our fears. Faith is casting our fears before Him, knowing He has power to help and that He cares for us. "*Your faith has made you well, go in peace.*"
