### **“SUFFERING & AFFLICTION”**

The question of suffering has perplexed people throughout the ages. Why do people suffer? What causes human suffering? What purpose if any, does suffering have in human life? Some people see suffering as a sign of the non-existence of God. Some people say, “if God really existed there would be no suffering.” Some people say “suffering is proof that if there is a God, He is not good.” Atheist writer Christopher Hitchens wrote a best-selling book entitled “God is not Good.” His premise was that suffering in the natural world shows that if there is a God, He is not good! If you have watched and cared for a loved one who endured extreme physical or spiritual pain, or if you have yourself suffered these things, you also may have wondered in your heart or asked out loud, “how a loving God could allow such suffering?”

There is suffering, because this world is separated from the fullness of relationship with the Creator, through its sin. The creation is no longer very good and humans are no longer good! We bring suffering upon ourselves through our actions. People bring suffering to other people through their actions. The creation is subject to decay, which results in natural disasters such as hurricanes and earthquakes. Suffering comes because of sin! God condemns sin and sends judgements on the world. Our bodies are born with defects, we are vulnerable to illness and susceptible to injury and death.

Of itself the question of suffering leads nowhere. It doesn't lessen suffering or make it easier to bear. If anything, the question makes us feel worse! To help us bear our sorrows, the scriptures speak abundantly about God's presence in times of affliction. The psalmist sang, “*God is an ever-present help at all times; especially in times of trouble.*” The scriptures speak of how God works His good in our lives in time and for eternity, through the hardships we all must face in life. St. Paul wrote in the letter to the Romans, “*We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.*” God works good through the sufferings and afflictions of life.

Most importantly, the scriptures speak of God sharing in our sorrows, giving us strength, encouragement and hope. God shares in our sufferings and afflictions most fully through the humanity of Christ Jesus. It is written in the letter to the Hebrews, “*We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses...Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace help in time of need.*” Suffering and affliction lead us to Jesus, through whom we receive strength to bear our burdens and the promise of a greater glory to come. St. Paul wrote, “*For this light and momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison.*”
